Paramedics Supporting the Covid-19 Response

Mobile Integrated Health - Community Paramedicine - Saskatoon


In collaboration with the Saskatchewan Health Authority, the Community Paramedicine program in Saskatoon has been operational since April 2015, where the 12-hour day shift was created to provide care for residents within Long Term Care and their own home to assist with decreasing the amount of Emergency Room visits. In May 2018 the 12-hour night shift was implemented, and this was to provide support to Primary Health Care in areas such as Home Care and the Community Intravenous Therapy Program (CITP).

Today, we have **ELEVEN (11) Advanced Care Paramedics** providing Community Paramedicine and SEVEN (7) who are now in full-time MIH CP positions. Three of our paramedics are endorsed Community Paramedics with the Advanced Certificate in Community Paramedic from Saskatchewan Polytechnic with an additional FIVE (5) enrolled.

Mobile Integrated Health - Community Paramedicine - Saskatoon Additional Peak Time Resource

In collaboration with the Saskatchewan Health Authority, the Saskatoon Community Paramedicine program is expanding with an additional 12-hour resource starting in Quarter One (Q1) of 2024-2025. The new community paramedicine resources will supplement the existing program by adding a peak time shift seven days per week. With the same scope of practice and services offered as the existing program, the new resource will focus on additional areas.



Emergency Room and Acute Care Referrals

- Working with emergency room physicians and offload paramedics to find appropriate support in the community and
- Supporting timely and appropriate discharge from acute care.

Saskatchewan EMS Treat and Referral Pilot Project Support

- Act as a pathway for the Saskatchewan Emergency Medical Services Treat and Referral Pilot Project,
- Provide support for clients who are enrolled and not transported through the pilot project and
- Be available to paramedics for consultation on treat and referral clients.

Direct Referrals from Saskatoon Paramedics

Ability to receive direct referrals from paramedics working in the Saskatoon 911 system.

Respond to Low Acuity 911 Calls

• With the implementation of LowCode[™]/Secondary Triage, the ability to respond to select determinants of 911 calls (Future State).


Mobile Integrated Health – Saskatoon Police Service Detention

At the recommendation of a Coroner's inquest, Paramedics were brought into the Saskatoon Police Service for a TWENTY-FOUR (24) hour period.

Paramedics are responsible to assess each individual brought into detention and make a determination as to whether an individual is medically stable or is in need of further medical care.

Today we have **NINETEEN (19) Primary Care, Intermediate, Advanced Care Paramedics** as well as a Community Paramedic working in Detention. Having Paramedics on hand in the detention with a community paramedicine lens allows for immediate treatment and assessment and provides a starting point to connect people with ongoing medical care and supports they may not have had otherwise.





Mobile Integrated Health - Community Paramedicine - Wadena

In collaboration with the Saskatchewan Health Authority, Medavie Health Services West (East Central) provides **ONE (1) Advanced Care Paramedic** based out of Wadena Monday through Friday.

Mobile Integrated Health - Community Paramedicine - Moose Jaw

In collaboration with the Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA) the Community Paramedicine Model in Moose Jaw is a connected care model, utilizing Community Paramedics to provide medical support and treatment as well as resources in a community-based setting for individuals who are experiencing mental health illness and substance use disorder.

The Community Paramedic *DOES NOT* replace routine practices, programs, or staffing, it is an *ADDITIONAL* resource available upon request, where ONE (1) Advanced Care Paramedic/Community Paramedic is available to respond from 9:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m. 7-days/week in a rapid-response vehicle to provide medical supports and treatment to patients and community stakeholder teams.



Today we have **FOUR (4) Advanced Care Paramedics/Community Paramedics** with endorsement through the Saskatchewan College of Paramedics and ONE (1) Advanced Care Paramedic currently enrolled in the Saskatchewan Polytechnic Community Paramedic Advanced Certificate Program.






Promising Practice



The design phase of the initiative began in the fall of 2022, with ten organizations focusing on the design of key initiatives for improving equity in access to palliative and resulted in published promising practices, including a published <u>Promising Practice for Medavie's Community Paramedicine team</u>.

The key initiative for the Moose Jaw Community Paramedicine team has been establishing wellness clinics to bring care to vulnerable populations who might not otherwise seek it.

Wîcihîtowin Project – Coming Together

The Wîcihîtowin (Coming Together) Project uses culture as a health intervention for alcohol and drug treatment.

The project works on re-establishing connections as a basis for holistic and integrated services and supports consisting of an Indigenous-led care team whose primary focus is on harm reduction and recovery.








In collaboration with the Saskatoon Tribal Council (STC), Medavie Health Services West Paramedics will be a part of a multi-disciplinary team to help provide medical and non-medical supports to those suffering from substance use. Today we have FIVE (5) Primary Care and Intermediate Care Paramedics on our Team, with ONE (1) who is an endorsed Community Paramedic and has completed the Advanced Certificate Program through Saskatchewan Polytechnic.


Mobile Integrated Health – Primary Health Care Health Bus

The Primary Health Care Health Bus has been providing primary health care services to residents of the Saskatoon core neighbourhoods for over a decade in collaboration with the Saskatchewan Health Authority. Since the closure of the health bus during the pandemic, the health bus is now relaunching to resume services within our communities.



Today we have **TWO (2) Primary Care Paramedics and ONE (1) Intermediate Care Paramedic** working within the program. There is one Paramedic working alongside a Nurse Practitioner 7 days/week and provide many non-urgent services such as:

Emergency Warming Centre Support

In early 2024, Medavie Health Services West and the Salvation Army Crossroads Residential Services engaged in a new partnership where ONE (1) Emergency Medical Responder was stationed at an

Emergency Warming Centre operated by the Salvation Army and located at St. Mary's Church in Saskatoon.

The one Emergency Medical Responder is available to clients at the emergency warming centre throughout the week, between 10:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m., responding to primary health needs and emergency situations as needed. The Emergency Medical Responder works closely with staff at the Emergency Warming Centre and Community Paramedicine to provide a connected care model for clients accessing overnight shelters.

These partnerships with the Salvation Arm Crossroads Residential Services are as a direct result of proof of concept through a partnership which brought community paramedicine into Salvation Army Crossroads Residential Services spaces through a 59-day Pilot Project in late 2022/2023.

Mobile Integrated Health – Emergency Department Paramedic(s)




Today, in Saskatoon as we are faced with increased health care system pressures, Medavie Health Services West and the Saskatchewan Health Authority have collaborated to integrate Paramedics into the Emergency Department.

EIGHTEEN (18) Advanced, Intermediate, and Primary Care Paramedics will be responsible for continuous observation, assessment, and treatments of all patient/clients within the Emergency Department such as the Paramedic Hold area, MAC (Minor Assessment Center) and Waiting Room; as well as the accessing of further social/economic resources if needed for the clients to assist in potentially early discharges or until their release from the Emergency Department.
